

Undergraduate Sustainability Certificate

The **Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Sustainability Certificate** integrates sustainability into general education and empowers students to approach primary courses of study through a sustainability lens. Students will learn and apply skills in the **equity-related, ecological, and economic dimensions** of sustainability.



The **Sustainability Certificate** requirements include a total of **21 credits: 9 credits of SUSC course work & 12 credits of SUSL course work.**

Along with 21 credits of sustainability designated courses, students will assemble a portfolio consisting of at least five assignments that demonstrate what a sustainability lens has brought to their major course of study.
